This survey will be conducted as if a burglar was attempting to break into your home. This will give you a better look at what a burglar is looking at when attempting to break in. Before this survey can be conducted, you must give consent to the undersign per DD form

This survey will be conducted for one of the following reasons:

1. Upon occupation of new quarters. (Government or Economy Quarters)
2. On request by appointment.
3. To look closely at your home after a break in has been committed to determine the cause of the break in.
